



House demolitions in the Negev

One of the principle methods by which the government hopes to implement its exclusive township policy is the demolition of houses when these are built illegally, while not providing any avenues for legal construction within the villages. Recently, the general director of the Ministry of Interior, Mr. Mordecai Mordecai has provided the following details concerning the policy of house demolitions: Out of an estimated number of 30,000 illegal structures (with 1,500 houses being built annually), 113 houses were demolished in 2002, and another 323 legal suits were served to owners of illegal houses. In 2003, 157 houses were demolished in the unrecognized villages in the Negev. In addition 45 demolition orders without criminal process were served in 2002. In 2004, by the end of June, 67 houses were demolished.

The government puts demolition orders on to houses that were built in this illegal fashion. From among the houses that received such demolition orders, the government then, in what seems to be a random manner, chooses to demolish only a fraction of these homes. The house owner has only to guess if it will be his house this time, and if it is, when the bulldozers will appear. More often than not, the house is therefore demolished along with the family property.

Since 2005 there were growing numbers of houses that were demolished. It seems that the Israeli government has been carrying out an unwritten policy of wiping from the face of the earth entire Bedouin villages in the Negev.

House Demolition and Corps Spraying Dairy

2001

- In October 2001, two houses were demolished in Qatamat village, on the claim that they were built within a firing-zone. The El-Gawweini family's houses have stood in this location for decades. After the houses were rebuilt, demolition orders were re-issued and one of the house owners was forced, under pressure of fines and criminal charges, to demolish his own newly built house.

2002

- In February 2002, six houses were demolished in Mazraa-Leshaba. Six shacks were rebuilt.
- In February 2002, about 12,000 dunams of a wheat crop that had benefited from an exceptionally rainy winter were sprayed with herbicides from the air and the crop was destroyed.
- In May 2002, on two separate occasions, Ministry of the Interior personnel and Green Patrolmen demolished the temporary houses of the Al Touri family who, after their fields had been sprayed, returned to live on their land in El Araqib, close to the town of Rahat. All their possessions inside the houses were confiscated.
- In June 2002, Ministry of the Interior personnel demolished the houses of six families of El Rebidi family, who had built shacks near the town of Laqiya, not having obtained plots inside the town. The houses were demolished with all their possessions inside.
- On June 27th, 2002, the Green Patrol demolished three houses: one next to Beer Sheva prison, belonging to the Abu Aiyade family, another at Bir Hadaj belonging to the Abu Lakima family, and a third in Bir Asluj, belonging to the Abu Issa family.
- On July 3rd, 2002, four houses were demolished in Wadi El Na'am, belonging to the Zanun family.



- On July 9th, 2002, Ministry of the Interior personnel demolished the two-story house of El Sayed Abd el Razek, backed up by large police and border guard forces while it was still under judiciary proceedings. The forces came to the spot at 4:30 a.m., ordered the family to leave without being able to take anything with them except the clothes they were wearing. There were 16 persons living in this house.
- On December 29th, 2002, the Ministry of Interior personnel once more destroyed two houses that had been rebuilt after they were destroyed by the government in July, one belonging to the Zanon family in Wadi Naam, and the other to Abu-Ayada family. In addition a building used for the Al-Nabari family business by Hura was destroyed.

2003

- On February 5th, 2003, on the eve of the Moslem Holiday of the Sacrifice, a mosque was destroyed in Tel el-Malach. This mosque was built in October 2002 in order to serve residents of the area that live at a large distance from other mosques. This the first time that a mosque was destroyed in the Negev, and a status quo between the Bedouins and the government was destroyed.
- On February 24th, 2003, a number of businesses on the Beer-Sheva - Dimona road were destroyed. These businesses supplied employment to scores of people who provide for hundreds of their family members, and are now without a source of income.
- On March 4th 2003, hundreds of dunams of wheat crops were sprayed with herbicides from the air. The entire crop of the residents of three villages by Ovdar was destroyed. This wheat is used to make bread, the major food source of these subsistence farmers. Together with the crops, also a number of children that were playing in the fields were sprayed.
- On April 2nd 2003, the Bureau for Land Management ordered another several hundreds of dunams of wheat fields to be sprayed, this time mostly belonging to the Al-Tori family (again). Again a few children and some livestock were in the fields, and were sprayed from the air together with the crops.
- On April 13th 2003, the government destroyed a family's residence, and a business that was destroyed on February was re-destroyed, along with another business. All of these belong to the Al-Assam family, located between Beer-Sheva and Dimona.
- On May 21st, the government destroyed another 11 structures. Among them is a brick and cement home in el-Foraa, a grocery store in Wadi Naam, a tin structure that was used as a hay storage place belonging to Muhammad al-Bdur who lives across from Laqiya, two businesses by Tel-Sheva.
- In June 2003, 200 extended family households of the Ubu-alqian tribe, about 1000 people in all, received notifications that their houses will be demolished. They are allegedly living on army training lands.
- On June 9th, 9 structures, belonging to the Ranami family, south of Beqa Valley were destroyed.
- On June 17th 2003, 300 dunams of crops belonging to the Al-Turi family were poisoned from the air.
- On July 1st, 2003, two houses of the Al-Huzayel family, in Dahiya were demolished.
- On July 15th, 2003, two houses and a shed were demolished in the village of Al-Saidiya, and a store in the Hira area.
- On August 11th, 2003, 8 structures in the area of Shoket junction, belonging to the Abu-Nadi and Abu-Sbeit families, in the village of Sawah, and also on 'Derech Hashalom', belonging to the Nassasra family.



- On September 9th, 2003, the government destroyed another six houses: four in Um-Ratam village, 5 kms west of Dimona, and two more in AlSer, by the Beer-Sheva prison. In addition, they demolished another structure in Zaarura, also by Dimona.
- On December 16th the government destroyed the gas station in Laqiya and a building that was designated to be a milk product company in Rahat.
- On December 30th buildings were destroyed in two locations: a Mosque in Zaarura, in the village of the Abu-Ajaj families, and six houses in Qatamat. In Qatamat the government had destroyed six houses only last year. Both villages are located near Hashalom Rd.

2004

- On January 15th 2004 three airplanes sprayed poison from the air on crops around the Negev. Among the crops sprayed are the crops of el Tori from the village of el Araqib. Salem abu Mdieghem's house in el Araqib was destroyed too.
- On January 20th 2004 in the morning hours three more houses were destroyed: two belonging to the abu Asa family in Um Batin, and one to the el Sayyed family in the el Sayyed neighborhood outside Hura.
- On February 10th 2004 the government once more sprayed poison on crops in the Negev. Once more al Tori's crops in el Araqib were sprayed, as were fields by Hura
- On March 9th, 2004, buildings were demolished in three villages: Wadi Gwein, Al-Araqib and Wadi Na'am.
- On May 10th, 2004, 10 buildings were demolished in two locations: Near the town of Rahat and outside Hura. 10 more livestock pens were demolished as well.
- On June 1st, 2004, 150 members of the Abu-Gamde (Al-Ranami) family were served with 50 demolishing orders for all structures in the village of Al-Sdir, near the Nevatim Air-Force base.
- On June 14th, 2004, the government destroyed 5 houses belonging to the Al-Na'ami family, outside Hura. Large police forces accompanied by bulldozers also arrived to the Abu-Algian family in the village of Yatir. The commander of the police forces did not agree to wail until restraining orders will be obtained by the family. Eventually, after violent clashes between the sides, the destruction of the houses was prevented, but not before 20 people were injured and 8 more were detained by the police.
- On August 25th, 2004. Large forces arrived to the village of Abu-Tlul, where they destroyed commercial structure belonging to Salem Abu-Isa. Three more Houses were also destroyed in the village of Um-Mitnan, leaving 34 people with no roof over their heads.
- On December 2004: Hundreds of demolition orders and evacuation orders: 50 in Al-Sdir, 70 in Wadi-Na'am, 140 in Um al-Hiran and dozens more in Tel-Arad.

2005

- On 10 January 2005, 3 houses belonging to the Azbarga family were destroyed in the unrecognized village of A-Sira.
- On 17 January, more than 1,100 dunams of crops belonging to the Al-Hamidi, Al-Rebaea and al-Atamin families in the area of Hashem Zane (South to Nevatim village in the Negev) were destroyed by tractors of the Land Authority.
- On 1 February, 4,000 dunams of crops were destroyed in Al-Aragib and Awagan. Large police forces surrounded the houses of the villagers on early morning hours to prevent resistance.



- On 9 February, 4 houses belonging to the Abu Marchil family were destroyed in the area of Ashalim, leaving 40 people without a roof over their heads.
- In May, residents of the unrecognized village of Wadi Na'am from the Al-Gargawi, Abu-Swilam and Abu-Afash families were served with 20 demolition orders.
- On 7 June 2005, large forces of the Israeli Land Authority have uprooted 270 trees in the unrecognized Bedouin village of Hashem Zane. The trees were planted during the last Land Day on 30 March this year. The residents of the village feel that this is part of a general policy aiming at forcing them out of their lands into the township of Segev Shalom.
- On 15 June, two commercial buildings belonging to Aharon al-Sayed were destroyed by the ministry of interior near the township of Hura.
- On June 21 st, one house belonging to Salame Al-Mahdi in the unrecognized village of Um-Ratam was destroyed. 10 people remained with no roof over their head.
- On 30 June, 168 demolition orders were issued in the village of Bir-Mshash. Due to the residents' resistance, only 16 were delivered. A 22 years old mother and her 3 years old daughter were injured from the police violence.
- On 6 July, 3 structures belonging to the Al-Gargawi family were destroyed in the unrecognized village of Wadi Na'am.
- On 12 September two houses were destroyed: one house in the unrecognized village of Al-Makyeman, near Omer and another house belonging to the Ak-Issu family near Tel-Sheva.
- On 19 September four houses were destroyed: two houses belonging to the Abu Juda family in the unrecognized village of Za'arura, one house belonging to the Al Ranami family in the unrecognized village of Al Bahira and one house belonging to the Al Kashar family in the village of Almazra'a
- On 9 November 2005 , three houses were demolished in there different locations: One house belonging to Salman Almrag in the unrecognized village of Abde, Northern to Mitzpe Ramon. One House belonging to the Abu Samra family in the unrecognized village of Wadi Na'am, near Ramat Hovav and one house in the unrecognized village of Kurnub, Western to Dimona.
- On November 23rd, a house owned by Salem Al-Assad was demolished in Ujan.

2006

- 5/1/06 Two structures were destroyed. Foundations of one house in the unrecognized village of Um Batin and another shack Southern to Rahat.
- 17/1/06 7 houses and structures were destroyed in three locations: One house belonging to Ahmad Al-Atayka, father of 5 children, and 3 stores in the unrecognized Bedouin village of Al-Batel, southern to Rahat. One house belonging to a family of 5 soles and one store belonging to the Abu-Sulb family, were demolished in the unrecognized Bedouin village of Abu-Tlul, of the Beer-Sheva – Dimona road. One house, in early stage of construction, belonging to the Al-Hawashla family in the unrecognized village of Tel a-Rashid.
- 8/2/06 - 2,500 dunams of wheat belonging to the Al-Turi and Abu-Altayef families were destroyed southern to Rahat. ([read more](#))
- 27/2/06 - 5 houses were demolished in the village of Um Mitanan, leaving 30 souls with no roof over their heads
- 16/4/06 - 400 dunams of crops were destroyed in three locations: about 100 dunams in the unrecognized village of Bir Hamam, belonging to Ali Abu Isaa. Approx. 150 dunams in the



unrecognized village of Hirbat al Watan belonging to the Abu Hurti family and another 150 dunams in the unrecognized village of Al Garin, belonging to Salame Abu Kaf.

- 24/4/06 a hat belonging to Nuri Al Ukbi in Al- Arakib was ruined. 8 more structures were demolished in the unrecognized village of Al Batel, Southern to Rahat, where a new neighborhood of Rahat is planned.
- 10/5/05 6 structures were demolished in the unrecognized village of Za'arura. A hat that was structured by Nuri Al Ukbi and volunteers from Recognition Forum was confiscated in Al Arakib along with a monument that Nuri has built.
- In May 2006 Some houses were demolished in Twail abu Jarwal.
- 6/6/06 Structures were demolished: 3 houses belonging to Amrani family in the village of Abu Tlul. Two more houses and a sheep sty, belonging to Abu Ayish family, were demolished in the village of A-Seir
- 7/6/06 - two houses belonging to Darwish Abu Rkayek were demolished eastern to Tel Sheva.
- 6/7/06 - eight houses were demolished in the Negev. Two houses belonging to Al Nabari family in the unrecognized village of Sawawin (Beer Sheva –Dimona road). Another six houses belonging to Abu Abayed family were demolished south-east to Lakiya.
- 12/7/06 - A restaurant and a car wash place were demolished in the Bedouin village of Al Sayed, near Hura. Two people were wounded and three more were arrested by the police during the demolition process.
- 19/7/06 - one house belonging to Udat family was demolished in the unrecognized village of Alza'arura, eastern to road No. 80.
- 31/7/06 - 5 houses were demolished: 3 houses in Um Mitnan belonging to Al Kashar family, one house in Bir Mishash belonging to Abu Sbit family and one house in Um Alhiran belonging to Abu Alqian family
- 16/8/06 - the authorities demolished 4 homes in two recently recognized villages. Two homes belonging to Nasser Abo Samra and Judeh Abo Hbaik were demolished in Beer Hadaj and two homes of Mohammed Al-Nabbari were demolished in Al-Grain.
- 30/8/06 - 6 houses belonging to Al Talalga family were destroyed in the area of Tawil Abu Jarwal. Dozens of the family members, including 34 children, remained with no roof over their heads.
- 6/9/06 - 8 houses belonging to Al-Na'ami family were demolished near Hura. Another grocery store, belonging to Al Hawashla family, was demolished at the entrance to Hura.
- 14/9/06 - On Thursday, 14 September, 5 houses were demolished in the unrecognized Bedouin villages:
 - In the village of Um Namila – One house belonging to Ali Kaid Al Huzayel.
 - In the village of Al Furah – two houses belonging to Yusef Gabuah and Hssein.
 - In the village of Um Mitnain – One house belonging to Hamis abu Ashiba.
 - In the village of Um Ratam – One house belonging to Ali Abu Megirah.
- 31/10/06 - three shacks and sheep pens were destroyed in the unrecognized village of Tawil abu Jarwal. Two more houses, belonging to Abu Rabia family, were destroyed western to Kseifa. A car belonging to Nuri Al Ukbi, in which he resided during the past few weeks, was confiscated
- 6/12/06 - 17 houses and three shacks, belonging to the Bedouin family of Al Talalka were demolished in Twail Abu Jarwal. Large forces of police and the Ministry of Interior arrived to



the village in early morning hours accompanied by 6 bulldozers to destroy the houses. This was the fourth time the village was demolished this year.

- 12/12/06 - four houses and one shack were destroyed in the unrecognized Bedouin village of Um Mitnan: One house belonging to Abu Ashiba Family and three houses and one shack belonging to Al Kashar family. 30 children remained with no roof over their heads in the cold winter.

2007

- January 9th 2007 – Twail Abu Jarwal, large forces of the "Land Administration Authority" (Minhal Mekarke'ey Israel) and Ministry of Interior demolished 21 houses in the unrecognized village, north-east to Goral Junction, near the Northern entrance to Beer-Sheva.
- January 29th – Al Jorf, About 100 houses, belonging to the Nassasra family, located south of Qseifa, were notified of Demolition Orders that would be handed by the authorities.
- February 1st – Amra Tarabin, 75 Demolition Orders have been handed to all the houses of the village. This included all the family members of the Tarabin family still living in their original village, adjoining the Jewish village of Omer.
- February 6th - Hirbet El- Batle, 6 houses have been demolished by the authorities in the village, south of Rahat. The village's area had been lately annexed to the city of Rahat.
- February 6th - About 1500 dunam (more than 400 Acres) of seeded fields south of Qseifa, as well as west and east of Araara, belonging to the families of El-Zarkan, Al-Hish, Al-Badoor, Gaboa and Abu-Adiya, were ploughed.
- March 7th – Twail Abu Jarwal, all houses in the village: 15 huts and 11 tents, were demolished again, for the sixth time in the last six months. This time the building materials as well as the tents were packed and taken away by the authorities. All the belongings, including kitchenware, were buried in the ground by the tractors.
- April 26th - demolition orders were issued to 35 houses in a village south of Hura. 250 people from the families of Al-Schita, Al-Aasem, Al-Aseibi, El-Batal are living in these houses.
- April 29th - 5 houses were demolished in the village of Abu-Zaied. The houses were destroyed by their owners in order to avoid causing distress to the kids, and to save the high expenses of replacing the destroyed material.
- May 9th - Twail Abu Jarwal, the village was demolished for the 7th time this year; 30 tents and shades were destroyed.
- May 21st - Atir, 4 houses in the village, north of Hura, were demolished, and 40 children were left with no roof on their heads.
- June 6th - Hasham-Zane, Abu-Ghanimeh family and their 6 kids house, was demolished along with 2 new houses that were built by young men who wanted to get married. The family guest room (Dewan) was demolished too.
- June 6th - Al-Arakib, the Green Patrol supervisors and policemen from the special patrol unit confiscated Nuri El-Ukbi's tent.
- June 13th - Amra-Tarabin, two houses in the village were demolished; 20 children were left with no roof on their heads.
- June 13th - Twail Abu Jarwal, the village was demolished for the 8th time.
- June 24th – Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent and some of his belongings were confiscated.



- June 25th - Um Al-Hiran, 14 houses in the village, north of Hura, were demolished. 150 people were left with no roof on their heads. All their possessions were taken to storage including: medicines, children books, school material, and food.
- July 5th - Alsera, 44 demolition orders were issued to all the houses in the village, near Nevatim air-base.
- July 19th - Twail Abu Jarwal, the village was demolished for the ninth time.
- July 19th - Hirbet Al-Watatn, two houses were demolished in the village, east of Tel-Sheva.
- July 19th- Wadi Al-Naam, one house was demolished in the village, west to Ramat Hovav industrial site.
- July 23rd - Um Al-Hiran, demolition of 14 houses was avoided, since families dismantled their own houses.
- July 29th - Twail Abu Jarwal, demolition orders were delivered to all the village houses (tents and huts).
- August 1st - Al-Jorf, 2 houses of the Al-Nassasra family were demolished. 16 people were injured during the demolition including children, elderly people and pregnant women.
- August 6th - saawa, the house of Adel Abi Sbit ad his family was demolished.
- August 23rd - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent and some of his belongings were confiscated.
- August 30th -Twail Abu Jarwal, the village was demolished for the tenth time.
- September 6th - Katamat, 6 of Abu Wadi's family buildings were demolished.
- September 6th - Bir-Hadaj, one large building was demolished.
- September 9th - Katamat, 2 houses were demolished.
- October 24th - Twail Abu Jarwal, the village was demolished for the eleventh time. Tents and belongings were confiscated.
- October 24th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's was arrested and his tent was confiscated.
- October 27th - Twail Abu Jarwal, officials accompanied with large police force tried to hand out demolition orders on the tents and sheds that were rebuild.
- November 1st - Wadi Al-Naam, demolition constructors accompanied with large police forces demolished 11 houses, 7 inhabited by new couples.
- November 1st – A-Sar, south of "Emeq Shara" industrial zone in Beer-Sheva, 4 houses were demolished.
- November 7th – Bir Al-Hamam east to Nevatim, 3 houses were demolished.
- November 7th – Al-Zarnug, one house of a new married couple was demolished.
- November 7th – Al-Grain, one house of a family with 6 children was demolished.
- November 15th – Al-Zarura, east of Keseifa, two houses were demolished, one house belonged to a family of eight people, one house was not yet inhabited.
- November 15th – Tel-Arad 2 houses were demolished, one house belonged to a family of sven people, and one house was not yet inhabited.
- November 21st – Abde area, six inhabited houses were demolished.
- November 22nd –Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was confiscated, while he had a surgery at the Soroka hospital.
- December 4th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was confiscated.



- December 11th – Twail Abu Jarwal, 4 huts and 4 tents that belong to the Al Talalka family were demolished. This is the twelfth demolition in the village.
- December 11th - Tel-Arad, a house of Al Amour family was demolished.
- December 11th – A house of Al Quran family was demolished near alsera.
- December 11th – Al-Ashab, A young man house who lives with his old and sick mother from Abu-Hdubeh family was demolished.
- December 11th – Bir Al-Hamam, a house of Abu-Asa family was demolished.
- December 11th – Al-Bat, A-Saraya family house was demolished.
- December 11th – Al-Madbach' two houses were demolished, one belong to a family with ten children and another house that was not yet inhabited, belong to a young man that planed to be married shortly.

2008

- January 2nd – Wadi Al-Meshash, near Hanegev Junction one shed was demolished, Wadi Al-Naam one shed was demolished. The building of the two sheds was just finished.
- January 10th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-ukbi's tent was dismantled.
- January 24th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was confiscated.
- February 5th - Twail Abu Jarwal, huts and tents that belong to the Al Talalka family were demolished. This is the thirteenth demolition in the village.
- February 21st – Al-Furha south to Arad, the house of Eiad Al-Maabde was demolished, as well as A "youth club" in the village of Kassar a-Sir and a grocery at Un-Mitnan.
- February 21st - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was dismantled by the Green Patrol.
- February 22nd - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's got a demolition warning for his tent. He was ordered to dismantle the tent in 48 hours.
- February 24th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was dismantle and confiscated in less than 48 hours that was mentioned in the demolition warning from Friday February 22nd .
- April 2nd – Amra-Tarabin near Omer, the house of Mohamad Tarabin was demolished for the second time this year, 14 children and their parents remained with no dwellings.
- April 2nd - Twail Abu Jarwal, 5 huts, 13 tents and 6 sheds that belong to the Al Talalka family were demolished. This is the fourteenth demolition in the village.
- April 9th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was dismantle and confiscated, along with some of his stuff.
- April 29th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was dismantle and confiscated, along with some of his stuff.
- June 10th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was dismantle and confiscated, along with some of his stuff.
- July 2nd - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was dismantle and confiscated, along with some of his stuff.
- July 2nd - Twail Abu Jarwal, the village was demolished for the fifteenth time.
- July 2nd – Wadi Al Na'am, 3 houses were demolished, in one of the houses lived a family in the other used to live orphaned and the third one belonged to a young fellow that planned to get married.



- July 8th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was dismantled and confiscated; a tractor formed heels of dirt so it will be difficult to rebuild the tent.
- July 17th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was cut with a knife and Nuri was attacked probably by a Jewish National Fund worker.
- July 23rd – Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Uqbi's tent was burned after he was arrested, in order for JNF (Jewish National Fund) workers to continue constructions they did on land that Nuri El-Uqbi had filed land claims.
- July 28th - Al-Arakib, Nuri El-Ukbi's tent was dismantled and confiscated, along with some of his stuff and loaded on a truck that belongs to the Jewish National Fund.
- July 31st - Twail Abu Jarwal, huts and tents that belong to the Al Talalka family were demolished. This is the sixteenth time of demolitions in the village.
- August 10th – Al-Qrin near Hura, 3 houses were demolished, Al-Zarura east of Qseifa, a house was demolished, Al-Baat north of Nevatim military air-base, a house was demolished.
- August 27th – Al-Araqib, four houses that were demolished in the past and two rows of bricks were left, have been demolished completely.
- August 28th - Twail Abu Jarwal, huts and tents that belong to the Al Talalka family were demolished. This is the seventeenth time of demolitions in the village.
- October 30th – Hasam-Zane, south to moshav Nevatim, two houses were demolished and 14 people remain homeless.
- October 30th – Twail Abu Jarwal, huts and tents that belong to the Al Talalka family were demolished. This is the Eighteenth time of demolitions in the village.
- December 3rd – Al-Makiman, north of Omer, 15 houses were demolished.
- December 15th – A small village, south west of Rahat (Karaur area), of 8 Al Atrash families was destroyed completely, 15 structures were demolished and 70 people were left with no housing solution.
- December 15th – A small village, south west of Rahat (Karaur area), 3 houses of Abu-Haduba's family was demolished. A court order was not issued to one of the houses.
- December 25th – Wadi Al-Na'am, an Ecological mosque was demolished.
- December 25th – Al-Makiman, north of Omer, a house was demolished and a family of 8 people, mostly kids, remain with no roof to their heads.
